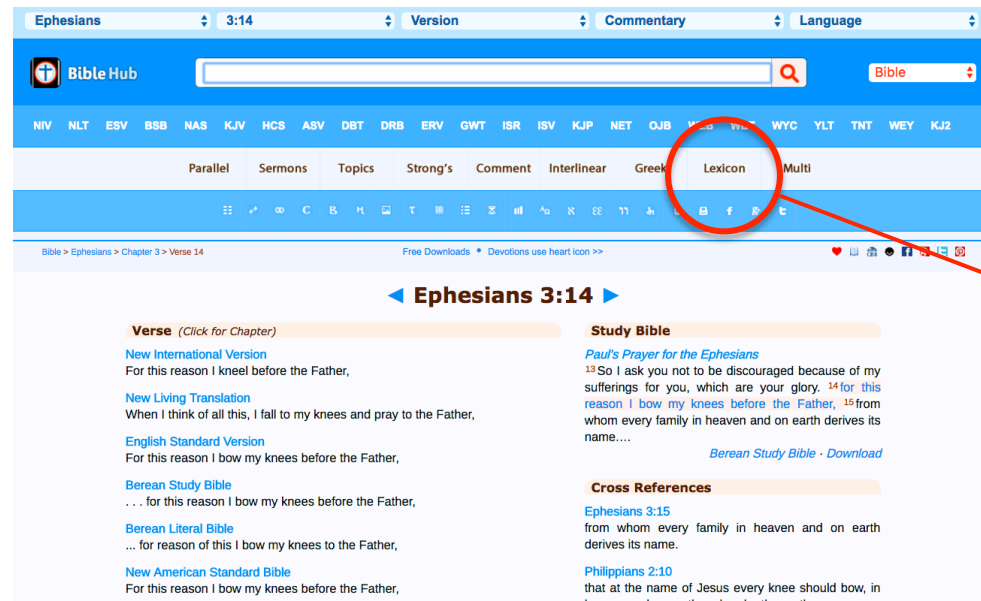

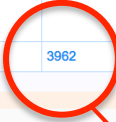
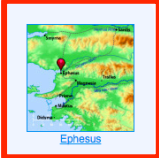

Strong's Concordance
patér: a father
 Original Word: πατήρ, πατήρ, ὁ
 Part of Speech: Noun, Masculine
 Transliteration: patér
 Phonetic Spelling: (pat-ayr)
 Short Definition: father, Father, ancestor
 Definition: father, (Heavenly) Father, ancestor, elder, senior.

HELPS Word-studies
3962 patér – father; one who imparts life and is committed to it; a progenitor, bringing into being to pass on the potential for likeness.
 3962 /patér (“father”) is used of our heavenly Father. He imparts life, from physical birth to the gift of eternal life through the second birth (regeneration, being born again). Through ongoing sanctification, the believer more and more resembles their heavenly Father – i.e. each time they receive faith from Him and obey it, which results in their unique glorification.
 [3962 /patér (“father”) refers to a begetter, originator, progenitor – one in “intimate connection and relationship” (Gesenius). Just as in the NT, the OT never speaks of universal fatherhood of God toward men (see. G. B. Steven’s concession, *The Theology of the New Testament*, p 70; see p 68) (TWOT 1, 6).
